

Counsellor Foot was inhumanly murdered on Thursday, at his residence in Rosbercon, within ninety yards of the Police station of New Ross. His brains were dashed out. His life was attempted before in March, 1833, by a ruffian who discharged a gun at him loaded with shot, which dreadfully injured him.

Yesterday, four men were brought before the the Magistrates at the Sessions of Clonlara, county Clare, at the prosecution of the Fishery Association, for illegally fishing with a net at Castle-Connell in the last month. They were convicted in the penalty of £5 each, or three months imprisonment in the Jail of Ennis; but having confessed the offence, given up their nets, and promised not to transgress again, the warrants were directed to be suspended, on a further engagement, that they would act as Watchmen on the river to prevent any fishing until the time prescribed by law.

Edmond Foley, of Mungret-street, a man in humble circumstances, committed suicide on Thursday last, by hanging himself from the cross-rail of his bed, having previously bid his little daughter leave the room that he might accomplish the fatal deed without notice. He had been melancholy some days before, and was heard to express himself tired of life. The Mayor held an inquest yesterday upon the body—Verdict, that he destroyed himself under temporary mental aberration.

Michael Caples, farm labourer, of Kilcoleman, died in the County Infirmary upon Thursday, of wounds inflicted by stones upon his forehead some weeks before on his return from digging potatoes. The brother and wife of deceased were examined before the Coroner's Inquest. Verdict of "Wilful murder against John and James Hayes," for whose apprehension the Mayor has issued his warrant.

Saturday a young woman of the name of Mary Donohoe, while playing with a grown boy, received the contents of a gun loaded with shot in the thigh, which he discharged at her, not knowing it was loaded. Fracture of the bone was the consequence, of which she died in Ennis Infirmary, the following day.

Three sisters are committed to Roscommon gaol for the murder of an illegitimate infant, the offspring of one of them.

On Thursday night the Church of the Foundling Hospital, Cork, was entered by some fellows from the rere, and two Silver Plates, a Silver Cup and Tankard stolen therefrom.

On Wednesday, Daniel Whealy, a school-master, whilst taking refreshment in a house at Nenagh, without any apparent indisposition, fell from his seat and was instantaneously a corpse.
