

A poor man, named Martin Dwyer, occasionally a mendicant, was found by the St. Michael's Watch in a very feeble and exhausted state in Catherine-street, on Saturday night, about ten o'clock. He was removed to the watch-house, where he expired in about half an hour. The Mayor held an inquest next day. Verdict—"Died by the visitation of God."
