BARBAROUS OUTRAGE-Saturday night last, or rather early on Sunday morning, a stable and part of the dwelling. house of Daniel Fitzgerald, farmer, at Laffane, near Askea. ton, was destroyed by fire, when four horses and four cows perished in the conflagration, which consumed beside quantity of property, including plough, harness, rack and manger, fattening stall, and various other useful articles. The footsteps of a single incendiary, evidently retreating from the burning premises, were discerned next morning, and a lighted sod of turf found in a wall adjoining. The damage incurred by this malicious arson amounts to upwards of £100. Fitzgerald was but recently a tenant on the above farm, and the name of the former tenant is Michael Foley, who gave occasional annoyance to his successor, when proceeding to till the ground.
