The meeting was then addressed by the Mayor, Mr. Walker, the County Engineer, Mr. Dickson, Mr. Russell, the Secretary, and several other Gentlemen, after which Samuel Dickson, Esq. was called to the Chair, and the marked thanks of the Gentlemen present were given to the Mayor, not merely for his highly dignified conduct in the Chair, but for his zeal in convening the meeting as he did, and for the sentiments to which he gave expression, which, as a citizen of Limerick and an Irishman, did him so much honour.

The meeting separated with three cheers more for their friends in Liverpool.

Margaret Hayes, the wife of a store labourer, who resides not far from the county Infirmary, died in that Institution yesterday; where she was received but half an hour before with a frightful gash or incision on her throat. A vast quantity of blood had rushed from the wound, which report says her husband in a passionate moment inflicted with a razor. He is in custody awaiting the result of a Coroner's inquest this day.

Peter Nihill, an Army pensioner, was found drowned at the rere of the City Gaol on Sunday last, having, it is thought, fallen into the water the night before at a very dangerous and exposed point which has proved fatal to others.

A lighter, laden with river sand, swamped in the rough stream of Curragour, below Thomond Bridge, on Monday, when two men of the name of Sweeny and Kennedy, who steered the frail craft, were swept away by the rapid flood, and would have perished but for the humane and prompt relief given by Captain Bartlett, of the brig Brothers, who instantly put off from the quay in a small boat, and picked them up in a most exhausted state near Wellesley Bridge.

A man named Terence Rourke, on his way home from Nenagh on Tuesday night, was, with some relations, waylaid at Doran's-hill, in the immediate neighbourhood of Newry, and so inhumanly beaten that he survived only a short time after. Two of the individuals concerned have been identified, and warrants issued for their apprehension.
