awaited the sitting of the Court for registry. Ennis Quarter Sessions commenced on Friday. Out of 40 notices served for registry in the Borough, 13 were admitted and 8 rejected—19 were registered for the County, and 13 rejected. 1382 Civil Bills were entered.

The City Sheriffs have received a free pardon from the Lord Lieutenant, for Thomas Jack, under sentence of transportation in the City gaol as a vagrant.

The Lord Lieutenant has been pleased to remit the remaining part of the sentence of imprisonment upon Daniel Collins, an inmate of the City gaol, for uttering base coin.

The presentments passed on the county Tipperary at last Clonmel assizes, are but of trivial amount, as the grand jury rejected many applications for error and informality.

There are but three convictions at the town of Galway Assizes—one to be transported 7 years for larceny, two sentenced to imprisonment.

Respite is received for John Burke, Moses Howlett, and Patrick Lavanagh, who were to have been executed at Kilkenny on Saturday for burglary and robbery.

Sunday night, out-houses, the property of Mr. Fennelly, of Ballintaggert, County Tipperary, were maliciously set fire to, and horrible to relate, four horses and thirteen cows were burnt to ashes.

Saturday night a fox-cover belonging to Mr. Lane, the magistrate, who gave evidence in the case of Police Sergeant Feeny's murder at Clonmel assizes, was maliciously destroyed by fire. On the same night some villains maliciously destroyed, at Lickfin, a young orchard, the property of Fergus Langley, Esq. a magistrate of the County Tipperary.

Broad-sheet posting bills, containing lists of the electors who voted at the last election for Tralee, are circulated in that town, and headed "Names of persons who voted for Maurice O'Connell, Esq.—the extinction of tithes and the independence of Ireland!" The lists also contain the names of denounced and excommunicated electors, Protestants and Roman Catholics, headed, "Names of persons who voted for William Denny, Esq. the blood-stained tithes, and against the independence of Ireland!"
