the County Limerick Infirmary, for which the Grand Jury  
have presented £100.

The County Grand Jury have directed the usual notices to  
be posted preparatory to amending the County tables, in the  
townlands of Bohergar, parish of Abington, barony of  
Clanwilliam.

Denis Hayes, a cottier, died in the County Infirmary this  
week of injuries he received from some persons, who beat  
him with sticks and stones at Cappamore, simply because he  
was connected by marriage with another party. The Mayor  
held an inquest upon the body. Verdict of wilful murder  
against persons not yet in custody.

A woman who gave the name of Mary Shaughnessy, has  
been taken in Ennis, selling broken silver plate, which she  
states she got from a servant near O'Brien's Bridge. The  
plate is crested with a Griffen's head, and the initials J. L.

Michael Donohoe is fully committed to Ennis gaol for  
the murder of Bridget Carrick, near Cratloe, in January  
last. She was dairy woman to Mrs. Frost, of Ballymorris,  
near the Shannon. It is supposed her body lay about a  
month in the river. Michael Dickson, of High-street, in  
this City, by trade a saddler, is also committed as a principal  
in the same foul crime. Dickson was arrested here by  
Sergeant-Major Abbott and Sergeant Bingham, of the Clare  
Police, the latter having by great industry and ingenuity  
successfully prosecuted his inquiries after the murder, which  
occurred near his station at Cratloe.

Monday morning, Captain Warburton, Chief Magistrate,  
with the police under his command, accompanied by Lieut.  
Ward and a party of the 91st Regiment, proceeded to the  
scene of blood, near Eyrecourt, where sub-constable Osborne  
was murdered, and succeeded in arresting a number of  
persons both present at and in the neighbourhood of the  
murder when it took place. An inquest was held on the  
body on Monday, when a verdict was returned of "Wilful  
Murder against some person or persons unknown."

Saturday last Lady Castlemaine was walking in the  
demesne of Moydrum, accompanied by Miss Edgeworth,  
when her foot happening to strike against a clump of wood,  
she was precipitated forward with such violence
