The lambs killed the other night at Newcastle, the pro-

One of those disgraceful riots, conducted in the most san-
guinary manner, took place on Thursday evening, at Pallis-
Kenry, where, but for the timely interposition of the Police,
(who conducted themselves in the most cool and determined
manner, tho' frequently knocked down, abused, and even
efforts made to disarm them,) lives would have been lost.
The party, only five or six in number, succeeded in taking
fourteen of the principals.

Michael Rourke, a labouring man employed in quarrying
at Clarina this day, after having made two ineffectual attempts
to blast a large rock, on inserting a third charge the whole
exploded, and the poor man was thrown up about ten feet
into the air. His face was totally shattered, both eyes
blown out of his head, his upper and lower jaws terribly
broken, and the skull fractured over the right orbit.—
Three fingers of his right hand were shattered to atoms; the
left hand was also injured. Very little hopes are entertained
of his recovery. He has a wife and three children.
