Grand Jury at Ennis Assizes, repayment of Cholera advances.

Mr. M'Dermott, one of the Commissioners of Public
Instruction Inquiry, is appointed Crown Counsel on the
Connaught Circuit.

An itinerant fiddler of diminutive form, not four feet high,
was this week committed to gaol for a murder perpetrated
six years ago. His name is John Conway, and the victim
of his wrath was Maurice Connell, a keeper in charge of
some property distrained for rent due to Frederick Holland,
Esq. in this county. A principal in this crime, a man of the
name of Ryan, was found guilty and executed for the same.

Wednesday, the Mayor held an inquest at the Exchange
upon the body of a new born female infant found at an early
hour same morning in a stable off lower Glentworth and
Cecil-streets, and which was then alive, but died shortly after.
Surgeon Franklin examined the infant, and finding no mark
of violence, was of opinion that death ensued from cold and
exposure. Verdict accordingly.

Michael Ryan, a boy of nine years, lingered in the City
Infirmary from Wednesday to yesterday, under a most ex-
tensive fracture of the head. He was looking at another
boy wielding a heavy stone in the Milk-Market, and which
unfortunately slipped from the hand of that boy, in the act
of casting it, and fell upon young Ryan's head. The blow
was fatal, but purely accidental. Stone throwing, in any
shape, has been repeatedly denounced as a dangerous amuse-
ment, but as yet with little effect, either upon idle boys
or adults.

State of the calendar for Tralee Summer Assizes:—Cow
stealing, 5; perjury, 1; rape, 6; murder, 8; sheep stealing,
5; attacking houses and appearing armed at night, 1;
burning a house, 1; highway robbery, 1—total, 22.

At Tralee Quarter Sessions, several persons pleaded guilty
to a riot and rescue of cattle, seized for tythes, by Mr. Rice
of Abedorney—bound to appear for judgment when called
up. Five men were sentenced to 3 and four months impris-
onment for riotous assembly at Tarbert fair. Mary Connor,
cyprian from Killarney, for robbery of plate, 7 years trans-
portation; Timothy Sullivan, for assaulting the Rev. J.
Murphy, Rector of Kiltullagh, was sentenced to six weeks
imprisonment, and to find bail for good behaviour.

At a Petty Sessions held at Castlegregory, Kerry, on
Monday, three retailers of spirits were convicted in several
penalties, amounting to £130, for not having licenses.

At Ballina Quarter Sessions the Rev. Win. Baker Stoney
was processed and decreed for killing lambs, by means of a
ferocious dog, his property. The Rev. Mr. Hart obtained
a decree against the Parish Priest of Turlough, for 16s. 2d.
tithes.

John Connell and Cornelius Godfrey, charged with the
murder of William Condon, have surrendered themselves for
trial at Clonmel Assizes.

There are 48 prisoners for trial in the county Galway gaol
at summer Assizes.

At Carlow assizes, Chief Justice Doherty admitted several
votes rejected by the Registering Barrister at Sessions.

At the fair of Roundstone, Galway, last week, a man
