

An address from Westmeath has been transmitted to Mr. Purcell O'Gorman, late Chairman of that county, expressive of the general regret of the peaceable and loyal inhabitants on his removal to Kilkenny. Mr. O'Gorman was the terror of the riotous and turbulent in Westmeath.

John Sheehy, of Ballinlanders, in this County, died on Wednesday of the gun-shot wound he received, as we stated on that day, and the assassins who are known have since absconded. He was the last life in a lease held under the Earl of Kingston, and the persons who panted for possession of the farm which his death would open to their views, took the above summary mode of gaining the wished for prize. We hope the monsters will meet their desert, a brief tenure on the scaffold.

Yesterday, James Bennett, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest at Cahirconlish, upon the body of an infant three weeks old, which was disinterred from the grave-yard in that place for the purpose. It appeared in evidence that a woman of the name of Norry Hinchy, was delivered of an illegitimate child, which she affiliated on Benjamin Blake, coachman to a Minister in that neighbourhood, and after depositing her infant burden departed. The reputed father left the infant in a barn all night, and where it was found dead next morning. He then procured a small box in which he put the body, and privately interred it in Cahirconlish Church-yard. The Jury found that the infant died for want of nourishment and from neglect. The Coachman has been committed for further examination.

Three men raising sand near Carrig island, in the lower Shannon, were drowned by overloading the boat. Five altogether were immersed in the water by this sad accident, but a second boat picked up two after struggling for many minutes in great exhaustion. The men who perished were James Hudson, Edward Barry, and James Sangster.

An hostile meeting took place yesterday morning between Messrs. Cudmore and Hunt of Clorane. After an exchange of shots without effect, the principals left the ground.

Sunday night last, two cows and three lambs were stolen from Mr. Edmond Carroll, at Bawnard, Kilfinan, bailiff to R. Oliver Gascoigne, Esq.

A cow was killed by lightning at Toryhill, near Croom, yesterday morning, the property of the Rev. Mr. Hartnett parish priest.

The Recorder of Galway sentenced three men to 7 years transportation on Monday for robbery.

Mr. Roger Helen, of Nelson Place, Cork, died suddenly on Wednesday. He was passing through Castle-street about two o'clock, and having turned into the shop of the Miss Hosfords, he had just laid his hand on the counter, when he fell down, and, without uttering a word, expired!

The Magistrates of Dublin have fined a person £10, and £4 10s. treble the value of necessaries in his possession, belonging to a deserter from the 14th Regiment.
