The Mayor of Cork called a public meeting yesterday, for the purpose of addressing the Lord Lieutenant on his visit to that city.

The High Sheriff of Louth has called a county meeting to address the Lord Lieutenant.

The only Irish members absent on the division on the second reading of the Irish church bill, were Earl of Belfast; Mr. Otway Cave, (by a fall from his horse) Col. Conolly, and Mr. Shaw.

Tobias Herbert, a youth of 16 or 17 years, apprentice to the printing business, fell from the side of a pier at the end of Francis-street, on Saturday evening into the dock, and a heavy stone which he had caught at, having fallen from near the top of the pier on his head, deprived the unfortunate young man of life in a few minutes.

A sailor named George Balford, about 20 years of age, was drowned on Monday evening whilst bathing in the Abbey river. He swam from the Salmon-weir bank across to the Island-bank, where he got entangled in a mesh of weeds, and sunk after a vain struggle to extricate himself. The Mayor held an inquest on the body yesterday—verdict, accidental death. It is a curious fact that the deceased was one of *twenty* brothers, and none of them brought up to the sea but himself.

A canoe was upset by the waves off Spanish Point Malbay, on Monday evening, in which were a father and two grown young men, his sons. The two young men were unfortunately drowned, and the old man, when thrown in upon a wave was rescued by some persons on the shore.

On Sunday last, two adverse factions, the Leahys and Curtins, proceeded to the village of Abbyfeale, for a trial of strength in a pitched battle as previously fixed. The Curtins, joined by the Hartnets, marched into the town about 200 strong, armed with sticks, and bayonets screwed on poles, scythes, one blunderbuss, four muskets, and several pistols; they shouted through the village continuously, and when their opponents did not appear, they withdrew to an adjacent field, to indulge in an abundance of the *native*. About 3 o'clock the Leahy party, not more than 50 strong, marched in at the opposite end of the town, and the war-hoop was set up by both parties, who ran like wild Indians to the conflict. After a short struggle the Leahy party, inferior in numbers and strength, were put to the rout; and as it was supposed that some of them took shelter with Mr. David Leahy, Innkeeper, the Curtin faction immediately surrounded Mr. Leahy's house, smashed 49 panes of glass, and mutilated all the doors and window sashes in front and rere of it, with stones and other missiles. A glass-case with its contents, and nearly every article in the *bar*, were smashed to pieces. Several of the inmates were injured by blows of stones thrown in through the windows. A child in bed, in an upper room, was struck with a stone. The house of a poor widow, named M'Auliff, was also broken in, and several others much injured.
