On Thursday Mr. Fitzpatrick's Waitstill won the all aged selling stakes of £5 and £25 added; and Mr. Mansfield's Fly beat Lord Milltown's Fusileer in a match for £50 each; Mr. Flood's Waterwitch won a sweepstakes of £5 and £25 added, and Lord Mulgrave's Conjuror won the Corinthian stakes of £10 for hunters, beating Mr. Hobson's Sir William, Lord Milltown's Quatre Bras, and Lord Howth's Stiff.

The election of a Treasurer and Secretary to the Lying-in Hospital was proceeded upon agreeably to notice, at an adjourned General Meeting of Subscribers on Thursday last. The Rev. Michael Keating is appointed Secretary, and Mr. David Fitzgerald, Treasurer, from the 1st of January next, the resignation of Rev. H. H. Rose, being at the request of the Meeting deferred until then.

Last evening, a murder was committed about two miles at this side of Croom, near Crecora, the victim being a labouring man, of the name of Coffey, in the employ of John M'Namara, whose house the party attacked with the view of robbery. M'Namara escaped badly wounded, but poor Coffey, in defending his master's property was killed, and three bayonet stabs were visible in his body.

Thursday last, a bench of Magistrates—John S. Brown, jun. Esq. chairman—assembled at Rathkeale, to investigate the report of an outrage alleged to have taken place on Sunday night, in the vicinity of Drehedtarsna, when a young gentleman was riding from Croom to Croagh, a number of persons having, it is said, attacked and fired at him on the road. After a full inquiry, the Bench came to a resolution that no such outrage had been committed. The Magistrates present were John S. Brown, jun. Rev. E. Croker, James D. Lyons, D.L. Geo. M. Maunsell, Ion Studdert, D.L. Henry Lyons, Thos. Royse, Robt. Peppard, and Wm. Smyth, Esqrs.

On Wednesday evening a country servant, or messenger of Mr. Synan, Grocer, in Mungret-street, returning home to his farm near Fedamore, the property of his master, was waylaid by several fellows, who dragged him down a barbeen or bye road, and brutally stoned him to death. His name was John Ryan, a most inoffensive man, who has left a wife and three children.
