Saturday, the Mayor held an inquest at the city Infirmary on the body of Edmond Hynes, who was taken there in a dying state with his throat cut. Verdict—died of injuries inflicted by himself, while in a state of mental derangement.

The Mayor and magistrates on Monday, fined and confined a number of idle and mischievous vagabonds, who had been amusing themselves at Christmas gambols, to the detriment of the public peace. The police were laudably active in apprehending all offenders.

Christmas eve a respectable woman of the name of Byrne, Duncan-street, Cork, was burned to death by the flame of a candle which ignited her clothes.

On Tuesday evening, being Fair evening at Kenmare, Co. Kerry, five ruffians forcibly carried off a young country girl named Mary Cronin, out of the village, and proceeding with her to an adjacent field, brutally violated her person. The police, under the command of Benjamin Jackson, Esq. went in pursuit immediately on hearing of the outrage, and brought back the poor girl in a state of great exhaustion. In the course of the night they succeeded in apprehending three of the perpetrators, and one on the following day, all of whom have been fully identified, and committed by the Rev. B. Herbert to abide their trial at the ensuing assizes. The names of the fellows concerned are:—John Donoghoe, (a married man); Daniel Casey, Michael Leahy, (tailors); John Sullivan, (labourer); and John Kelly, (a married man,) labourer. Sullivan has succeeded in evading for the present the active search made for him; but from the indefatigable exertions of Mr. Jackson, every hope is entertained of his speedy apprehension.

On Thursday night last, the Constabulary party stationed in Croom, succeeded in arresting Pat. Walsh and Catherine his wife, residing near Tory-hill, under warrant of T. P. Vokes, Esq. C.M. charged with stealing two firkins and two kegs of butter, supposed to be the property of John Christy, Esq. of Mountarl. On the same night same party, on patrol, took down an illegal notice posted at Carass-cross, cautioning any person who became a tenant on the farm of the widow Hickey with the death of Dawson, and especially the traitor Hogan, who is worse than Vokes.

A fine fat sheep, the property of Mr. Paris Anderson, was killed on the lands of Glenview, near Birdhill, on the night of Wednesday. All taken away but the head, fat, and entrails.
