been received at the LIMERICK CHRONICLE Office. Mr. W. Brady, lockmaster at Brewer's Mills, Kingston, and Mr. John Murphy, Clerk of the concern, were drowned by falling into a sluice at night. Mr. Beswick, late Quarter-Master Serjeant, 15th Regiment, was killed by the accidental explosion of his fowling-piece at Toronto, and was interred with military honors. He was a native of Manchester. At the prosecution of the Adjutant of the 32d Regiment, in Montreal, Thomas Hartgave was convicted in a penalty of £5, and treble the value of the articles, for having purchased part of the equipment of a soldier. A member of the Legislative Council of Quebec, and a member of the House of Assembly at Quebec, fired three shots each without effect, for a supposed insult from one to the other at a ball given by Lord Gosford. The anniversary of the Patron, St. Andrew of Scotland, was celebrated throughout North America with splendid processions, music, public dinners, and suppers.

Yesterday morning, William Smith, Esq. Sub-Sheriff, proceeded hence with Captain Randolph's company of the 94th Regiment, and a Serjeant's party of the King's Hussars, to enforce an execution for tythes at the suit of the Rev. W. Scott, Rector of Pallis-Grean, against a farmer named Thomas Ryan, who lives on the Tipperary line of road about eight miles from this City. The Sheriff made seizure of 10 cows, but sooner than drive them off the farm defendant paid that Officer both debt and costs, amount £17 10s. which he might have avoided in the first instance by discharging the original sum due for tythe, only £6.

The Rev. Edward Herbert, a truly pious and exemplary clergyman, Rector of Kilpeacon, has found it absolutely necessary to apply to the Mayor and Magistrates for a police force, in order to protect himself and family from insult and annoyance, whenever they venture beyond the precincts of their residence in that part of the country.

Yesterday morning, Johanna Shanahan, an aged lone woman, mother of one of the Mayor's Constables, was found upon the floor of her residence in Mary-street, burned to death, a chair partly burned, and a candlestick smeared with grease lying close to her lifeless corpse. She had not been seen for two days before, and alarm being spread, her door was burst open, and the sad relics of mortality were immediately visible. The clothes on her person were consumed so as to resemble burnt paper, and it is quite evident she had been dead some hours, having fallen probably in a fit at night, and was unable to recover herself, when the flame of the candle must have ignited her dress. The Mayor held an inquest upon her body, but no positive clue to the fatal event could be found.

At the usual meeting of the Magistrates and cess-payers yesterday at the Tholsel Court, to receive applications for presentments against the ensuing Spring Assizes, a presentment for a new bridge over the river Mulcaire, at Annacotty, on the Dublin road, was approved of. This will be a work of great public utility, as the present structure has been many years a dangerous nuisance.
