Morgan Behane, one of the survivors of the wreck of the late Francis Spaight, of and for this port from N. America walked into a shop at Arthur's-quay, on Wednesday even ing, and sat upon a form, resting his head upon the table close by. The poor fellow was a corpse in less than the minutes! His health had been greatly impaired by the sufferings endured upon the wreck, and his emaciated ap. pearance bore painful testimony of scenes from which the mind recoils with horror.

The body of a mariner was taken out of the river yester, day evening below the Pool, and brought up to the quay, A watch was found in his pocket. He is supposed to have been the sailor who fell overboard a vessel in the Pool, about

three weeks ago, and was drowned.
