public house at Boherbuoy on Tuesday night, and having

Police Serjeant Riedy traced the dame to some of her haunts,
and searching a chaff bed found therein, rolled up in a stock-
ing, a bundle of bank notes, which Meagher identified as
his property. The woman, Bridget Mulvehill, is committed
to the city gaol. In all cases of stolen goods, money, or
other valuables, the Police establishment cannot boast a
more efficient and meritorious public officer than Serjt. Riedy.

Last evening, while the Rev. Thomas Westropp, jun. was
preaching at George's church, some wicked ruffian in the
street dashed a stone in through one of the windows, smash-
ing the glass and falling in the midst of the congregation,
who were excessively alarmed, especially the female portion.
This is the third attack upon Protestant Churches in this
City within the last few weeks.

David Rahilly, a grown boy, died at Adare recently of
smoking and whiskey drinking, as appeared on the inquest,
by the evidence of Surgeon Johnston.

John Scott, of Cahircon, Esq. has succeeded in his bene-
volent efforts to raise the unfortunate Kildysart sail-boat,
which was sunk near Beagh Castle last January, under such
melancholy and fatal circumstances. Having enlisted the
kind co-operation of Mr. W. Williams of the Inland Navi-
gation Company, that gentleman had the Clarence Steamer
to assist Mr. Scott in the task, and the sail-boat was weighed
up this week, to the great joy of the family and friends of
the owner.

On Wednesday the Mayor and Magistrates granted eleven
new applications for spirit licenses, and rejected 13 more.

The High Sheriff of Kildare called a county meeting at
Naas this day to address Lord Mulgrave. The requisition
is signed by the Roman Catholic Bishop, and 17 Priests;
by three Protestant Clergymen, Rev. E. Tighe Gregory,
Rev. James R. Reade, and Rev. D. Amildowney.

The Right Rev. Dr. Kinsella presided at a public meeting

The Court of Exchequer, this week, overruled a decision
of Judge Perrin, at Cork Assizes, and found in the case of
Rev. W. Kellett v. Philip Ryan, that with defendant rested
the onus of proving he was not exempt from payment of
tythes.

Thomas Day, Esq. of the late Kerry Western Herald
Newspaper, was tried at Tralee Quarter Sessions, for having
struck with a stick on the head, Captain Charles Fairfield,
a magistrate of that county, in the Tralee Club-room. Capt.
Fairfield swore Mr. Day called him a coward, robber, and
