The Waterloo convict ship for New South Wales, and having on board as a guard detachments of the 28th and 50th Regiments under the command of Major Cotton of the former Regiment is arrived at Kingstown Harbour, Dublin. The Earl and Countess of Kenmare have left Paris on return to Killarney.

Mr. Deane, the enterprising gentleman whose scientific apparatus enabled him lately to raise many articles, including pieces of brass ordnance, from the wreck of the Royal George at Spithead, has arrived here with one of the Underwriters, and left for Kilkee, to assist in recovering the copper sheathing and other valuable materials of the merchant vessel from Liverpool to New Orleans, lost there some weeks since.

Captain G. Jameson is appointed assistant Auditor General at Bombay, vice Johnson.

It is reported that Lord Brudenell does not go out to India, as the 11th Light Dragoons may be soon expected home.

Hugh Brohan, a labourer employed in clearing out the late O'Brien's Bridge mills, on Sunday last, ventured in spite of remonstrance into a dangerous part of the interior, where he fell with the remains of a half-burned loft into a heap of hot cinders, when his clothes immediately took fire and spread with such scorching virus all over his body, that the unfortunate man did not survive the injury many hours.

In consequence of an erroneous view taken of the arrears of tythe, in the new Irish Tythe Bill, by the Dublin Freeman's Journal, we have to explain that the 1st section of the bill does *not* abolish all arrears of tythe, but re-payment of the sums, made by instalment under the Tythe Million Act, is remitted.

In Keane, administrator, *v.* Massy and others, the Court of Exchequer has ordered substitution of service of tythe notice and writ of assistance, on affidavit of process server, who deposed that having proceeded to the lands in the parish of Knockroe, in the county of Limerick, where defendents resided, for the purpose of serving tythe notices, a great number of persons collected, most of them armed with spades, and drove deponent and his assistants off the lands, threatening their lives if ever they went there again to serve such notices. In same *v.* Power and others, Counsel applied, on the affidavit of the process server, who, accompanied by two others, proceeded to the lands of Herbertstown, but a large collection of men, armed with spades and pitchforks, met them on the lands, when deponent and those with him had to run for their lives; they were pursued for several miles, and pelted with stones the whole of the way. Order granted.

The Rev. W. Travers Homan having applied to the Court of Exchequer to appoint a receiver of the rents of Ballycollen, county Waterford, on account of tythes due thereout by Richard L. Sheil, Esq. M.P. the Court has granted a conditional order.
