There was a violent thunder-storm on Sunday last, accompanied by lightning. At Castletown Conyers, in this County, a horse was killed by the electric fluid, and two cows on a farm of Mr. Lombard, in that neighbourhood.

James Whelan, of Oulah, in this county, was assailed by three men a few days since, who gave him a fractured head; and John Hassett, of Herbertstown, was left in the same precarious situation, under like circumstances.

There was a Meeting at Tralee, on Sunday, Capt. Leyne in the Chair, to petition the House of Commons against the amended Corporation Bill of the Lords. There was a similar meeting at Cahercavine, Kean Mahony, Esq. in the chair.

An Inquest was held on Thursday last, before John Cox, Esq. on the body of Michael M'Namara, who was found dead in a dyke near Adare. It appeared by the evidence of Dr. Jobuston, who made a post-mortem examination, that M'Namara died of a fit of apoplexy, and the Jury returned a verdict accordingly.

James Belcher, of the Police at Ardnacrusha station, took up on Thursday, two stray yearling Devon Heiffers, which are now in the City pound.

Sunday night the tongues were cut out of three calves, the property of a farmer of the name of Condon, residing on the lands of Bosnets-town, near Kilfinane, by some brutal incendiaries yet undiscovered.

Waterford County Gaol, from which 14 prisoners escaped on Sunday evening, is represented as the worst in Ireland for safe custody, and was condemned by the Inspectors.

On Wednesday night last last, that active Constable, Richard Coe, stationed at Galbally, succeeded in taking up three stand of arms in the Glin of Aherloe, Tipperary; they were concealed in three different houses, in excellent order, all newly stocked.

Edward Herbert, a mischievous idiot recently taken off the streets by order of the Magistrates, and sent to the house of Industry, was found dead in that Institution on Thursday morning, having gone to bed the night before without any symptom of ailment. An inquest was held on the body. Verdict—died of the visitation of God.
