DEATHS.

On Tuesday night, at Wellpark, Ennis, after a lingering illness,  
in the 76th year of his age, the Right Rev. Patrick M'Mahon, D.D.  
Roman Catholic Bishop of Killaloe. He was consecrated Coadjutor  
Bishop of that Diocese in 1819, and in ten years after, on the death  
of his predecessor Dr. O'shaughnessy, succeeded to the Prelacy. His  
remains were interred at Quin Abbey on Thursday, when upwards  
of 60 carriages attended the funeral cortege, including those of  
several Protestant families. Dr. M'Mahon died worth about £4,000, of  
which £1000 is devoted to charity, and the remainder to his relatives.
