The following convictions took place this week before the Magistrates:—Denis Regan, fined £5 or two months imprisonment, for violent assault on William Connell, of St. Michael's night watch. William Connors, assault on persons in the streets, fined 2s. 6d. or 7 days imprisonment. Pat. Byrns, John Carroll, and Daniel Byrns, rioting and assaulting the Police, fined £5 each, or two months imprisonment. Denis O'Brien, assault and rioting, fined 2s. 6d. or a week's imprisonment. John Kiely and John Quin, stone throwing in the streets, fined 10s. 0d. each, or one month's imprisonment.

Mr. John Worrall, Deputy-Governor of the City gaol, has recovered the valuable watch, stolen about three weeks since in a house of bad repute, from a visitor of the name of Mur-nane from the country, and which case was before the Petty Sessions.

Simon Allen, a labourer, of the Redgate, North Liberties, who went on Thursday morning to the embankment at Coonagh, in search of employ, fell into the river and was unfortunately drowned.

Constable Hayes, and his party of Constabulary, at Kilmallock, proceeded to Ballingooly, on the night of Thursday, and succeeded in arresting John Meany, Pat. O'Donnell, and David O'Brien, charged with the savage attack on Walsh and his party, in May last, whilst serving Exchequer subpœnas at the suit of the Dean and Chapter of Limerick, at Ballingady. It will be remembered that it was this active Constable, and not Hare, as stated on a former occasion, who, at the risk of his life and that of his party, rescued those devoted victims, from the fury and impending destruction of the numerous mob who attacked them.

The Quarter Sessions for Tralee, commenced on Monday last, before P.M. Murphy, Esq. Assistant Barrister, when six voters (four of whom are Conservatives,) registered for that borough, and two for the county.—1438 civil bills were entered for trial, and 53 ejectments. The number of prisoners for trial at the assizes of Tralee is only 25, viz. murder, 4; rape, 6; larceny, 8; sheepstealing, 2; uttering base coin, 1; and attacking houses in arms at night, 1, at a quarter past one o'clock.

The Tipperary Police arrested two midnight incendiaries, and two murderers, this week, the former for burning a herdsman's house at Rockwell, the others for murder of Denis Murphy, at Tourneebrien.

The presumed intention of Government to appoint a resident Stipendiary Magistrate in the tranquil barony of Burren, county Clare, has given much umbrage in that quarter, although great inconvenience arises from the scarcity of resident Magistrates.

Michael Harte, for the murder of his wife, at Claremorris, is to be tried at Castlebar Assizes.

The Recorder of Waterford this week, sentenced Daniel Meehan, a street robber, to transportation for seven years.
