At his residence, Shannon-View, in this county, - at an advanced  
age, John Southwell Browne, Esq. of Mount Browne, many years  
one of the most respectable Grand Jurors and Magistrates of this  
County. In private life Mr. Browne was a truly amiable and  
honourable character. His remains were interred at Rathkeale,  
attended by a great cortage of the resident gentry, and followed by  
an immense assemblage of country people.
