## CHRONICLE.

NOVEMBER 1.

Sydney, New South Wales,  
n regt. under command of

terms. The Hon. Mr. Kennedy, acting Governor of Bermuda, Dr. Hunter, Mayor, Counsellor Harvey, and Mr. Stephen Egan, a wealthy Irish merchant on the Island, were distinguished for their beneficence on the occasion. The 30th Regiment are well at Bermuda.

Quebec Papers and Letters to the 28th of August were received at the CHRONICLE OFFICE to-day. Capt. Walsh, late of the 3d Buffs, who so pre-eminently distinguished himself as Ensign of the corps at the bloody action of Albuera, where he fell desperately wounded, and when the flag-staff was shot away, preserved the colour in his breast. This veteran and gallant Officer is a prisoner for debt at Niagara, having lost his all in a speculation he did not understand. The 2d Royals had not arrived out by the last accounts.

This morning at six o'clock the remains of the late Right Hon. Lord Massy arrived in this City from Kilkee, the scene of his much lamented death, and moved onwards to Duntryleage for interment in the family vault of his ancestors, attended by a numerous cortege of gentry, whose carriages joined the melancholy procession, which swelled beyond all calculation, when the crowds of tenantry and country people, for a distance of several miles, fell into the mournful cavalcade. The present Lord Massy, eldest son of the late Peer, is a minor, and in his eighth year.

Viscount Duncannon has left Mountshannon, the mansion of the Earl of Clare, for Besborough, his lordship's seat in Kilkenny.

The Earl and Countess of Charleville arrived at Charleville Forest, Tullamore, yesterday, where they intend to have many visitors.

The Earl of Norbury passed through yesterday from Kilrush, after a visit to Crofton Moore Vandeleure, Esq. and his Lordship's relative, Lady Grace Vandeleure.

Alderman Robert Pentland is to be Mayor of Drogheda for the ensuing year. W. H. Shegog and James Medicott, Esqrs. sheriffs.

His Grace the Archbishop of Tuam has been pleased to present the Rev. Edwin L. Moore, Curate of Tuam, to the valuable living of Cong, vacant by the removal of the Rev. Cecil Crampton, brother of Judge Crampton, to the living of Killacan, diocess of Meath.

The Lord Bishop of Cork, held a confirmation at Cove on the 13th, at Cloyne on the 15th; at Blarney on the 17th; at Mallow on the 20th; at Doneraile on the 21st; at Mitchelstown on the 22d; at Fermoy on the 23d; and at Macroom on the 27th ult.—and immediately after the confirmation at each place, held a visitation of the clergy of the adjoining district. The attendance of persons to be confirmed was very considerable. During the progress of his tour he made an extensive inspection of Churches and Schools.
