The fate of the unfortunate Captain Maguire who was basely butchered in cold blood, has been intimated to tenants on the lands of Kilmoyler, County Tipperary, in the shape of Rock notices served by armed men last week.

On Sunday evening about ten o'clock, two shots were fired into the Rev. Mr. Bagwell's Glebe-house, at Clonkelly, and a notice left, commanding him not to seek for tithes, or he should be paid in lead! They gave him this warning as he was hitherto an inoffensive man.

The desperate gang of midnight marauders that broke into Ballygrennan house, the residence of Mr. Benn, and presented fire arms at Mrs. Benn and her sister, while plundering the premises, have at length been fully discovered by the vigilance of our City Police. The principals in the outrage are—Anthony Grimes, Patrick Stundon, and James Donovan, who were all arrested at Thomond-gate by Sub-Constables William Corneal and Thomas Coe. The last of the gang, Donovan, was taken at the height of Thomond-gate on Thursday evening by Sub-Constable Corneal, to whom he admitted his participation in the attack and robbery, and has since turned approver, implicating his guilty associates in the disclosure he made.

On Thursday morning, a fine boy named Shanks, aged three years, was burnt to death in Windmill-street, by its clothes catching fire, in the absence of his aunt, who only retired to an adjoining yard for a kettle of water.

Since Thursday morning there has been incessant heavy rain, which prevents the country people looking after their potatoe crops, for which some fears are beginning to be felt.

Landed proprietors at either side of the Lower Shannon, whose localities may offer advantageous sites for piers or quays, should bestir themselves for the improvement of their neighbourhoods, as the Board of Works are disposed to advance sums of money for such undertaking, so essential to the welfare of agriculture and commerce.

The new rules of the Irish Court of Chancery, signed by the Lord Chancellor Plunket and Sir W. M'Mahon, Master of the Rolls, have just been published, in which the regular fees are fixed for issuing a writ of rebellion, though the Solicitor-General contended these writs were obsolete at the time the question was raised in the Court of Exchequer last Term.
