John Waller, of Castletown, Esq. the incorruptible patriot, the truly dignified gentleman, the upright magistrate, and most indulgent landlord, expired yesterday morning, full of years and honor, at his paternal mansion, Castletown-House, in this county, to the deep affliction of his highly respectable family and connexions, and the sincere, the boundless grief of a numerous tenantry, whose comfort and happiness was a primary object of his good and virtuous life. Mr. Waller was chosen at a critical period to represent his native county in Parliament, and has been one of the last few surviving members of the Irish House of Commons, that opposed the measure of Legislative Union. He was re-elected almost without a dissenting voice by his constituents. As a politician, or a private gentleman, the inheritor of an affluent fortune, and, from principle, a constant resident on his estate, the spotless career of so bright and rare a character was regarded with feelings of pride and veneration by his admiring countrymen, while the amiable and endearing traits which influenced every action of a well spent, useful life. must enshrine his beloved memory in the grateful hearts of that industrious class, whose patron and benefactor he was to the last period of his existence. He was the friend of suffering humanity, in the fullest sense of the word. His remains will rest with those of his ancestors, in the family vault of Castletown Church.
