PORT OF CLARE.—The Survey ordered by the Shannon
Commissioners of this beautiful port commenced yesterday.

At the Carrick Petty Sessions, Lieut. Brooke, 23d
Fusileers, was fined £1 and costs, for shooting a dog belong-
ing to Miss Lloyd.

The extensive stabling and out-offices of Robert Robin-
son, Esq. Distiller, Birr, were destroyed by fire on Tuesday
night, and of 112 fat oxen on the premises, 58 fell a prey
to the flames, and were burnt to death, despite of all exer-
tion to release them from the stalls, where the entire herd
were made up for the night. The bellowing of the cattle
in the midst of this destructive conflagration was frightful,
and the loss to Mr. Robinson is several hundred pounds.
It is thought the fire was the act of an incendiary, as next
morning some half burnt coals were found in the ruins.

Terence Blake, one of the last surviving sufferers by the
late dreadful explosion of gunpowder, died this day in the
City Infirmary. This makes the 19th victim; although, if
we add a female that died of the absolute effects of fright,
the catalogue makes twenty.
