On the night of the 16th instant, an armed party of men  
about sixteen in number, forcibly entered the house of Mr.  
Edmond Keating, of Gurrane, parish of Manister, in this  
county, whom they beat in a savage manner ; and they then  
proceeded to the house of Thomas Cahill, whom they also  
beat so severely, that he died next day ; and the same party  
then paid a threatening visit to the house of Mr. Jeffrey  
Keating, of Grangehill, in the above parish.

A labouring man of the name of Thos. O'Brien, was found  
dead on Monday morning, inside a ditch by the high road  
at Cahirnarry. The Mayor held an inquest, when it ap-  
peared he perished of cold and exposure to the inclement  
weather at night.

Two of the North Strand boatmen returning up the river  
from Askeaton on Saturday discovered the body of a woman  
floating on the water near Tervoe. They brought her remains  
to the Police-Office, where the Mayor held an inquest, and  
the Jury returned a verdict found drowned. The name of  
the unfortunate woman is unknown, but several pawnbroker  
duplicates were found in her pocket bearing the signature  
of Keane.

Nothing can exceed the distress of the poor in the neigh-  
bourhood of Dingle, for want of fuel in this inclement wea-  
ther—not a hedge has been left in the surrounding country
