Mr. Patrick Dooly victualler, of this city, returning home
from Newmarket last Sunday evening, was thrown from the
horse he rode, at Bunratty, and died in a few hours of frac-
ture in the head.

A servant girl from the house of Mr. Sheehan, George's-
street, died in hospital, on Saturday night in hospital, having
fallen into the fire-place in a fit of epilepsy.

On Thursday night last, the mane and tail of a valuable
mare, of George Furnell, Esq. were cut off, on the lands of
Ballycane; and Egan, a very respectable farmer, a tenant
of Mr. Furnell's, on whose lands she has been for the winter,
was taken out of his house and flogged not long before. It
is surprising that no exertion has been made by the Govern-
ment to quiet that part of the country. The party that shot
Williamson's horses and Mr. Peacock's, consisted of eight
men, well armed, and their guns in excellent order, and
their Captain had a sash on.

The same party that shot the horse, &c. at Mr. Peacock's,
of Dooneen, went to the lands of Fanningstown, and shot
two horses of Williamson, a farmer, that he sent to plough
there, and swore the old woman in the house to direct per-
sons of the name of Frawleigh, care-takers of Williamson's,
to leave the farm, or that they would shoot them if obliged
to go there again. The farm house on those lands was burned,
and the Frawleighs flogged, about three months since.

A fire broke out in a house in Newcastle, a few nights past,
which much alarmed the inhabitants; but by the timely assis-
tance of the detachment of the 90th Light Infantry, quar-
tered there, the fire was promptly got under.

Friday morning, a man of the name of Darby Daniher, a
cartwright, from Newcastle, was found drowned, or smothered
in a ditch at the road side, about two miles from that town,
on the Cork road, after having been to a funeral the previous
day, where he drank more whiskey than was prudent.
