Stephen E. Collis, Esq. is foreman of the Grand Jury of the Quarter Sessions Court for Kerry held at Listowel.

The Surgeon-General consents to resume the Presidency of the Zoological Society, Dublin.

The late Irish Bankrupt Commissioners are pensioned off at the salary of £90 to £130 a year each.

At the Curragh, on Saturday, Lord Miltown's Cushneiche match of £50 each from Mr. Holmes's Vigo. Mr. Langford won the King's plate of 100 guineas for 3 mile course; and Mr. Ferguson's Harkaway, 3 class Madrid stakes of £25 each. Mr. Watts' Black-wagon won the Mulgrave handicap £20, and £100 added, beat Colonel Westera's Thump, and Lord Miltown's Argirio. Hunter's Beggarboy won the 2d class Corinthian stakes £10, and £20 added.

The Cork Protestant Orphan Society last year, added 19 to the establishment, making a total of 75 on the year, and the income of the Institution in that period was £547 of which £205 is due to the fervent appeals of Hon. and Rev. Ludlow Tonson.

On Saturday last, the Rev. T. H. Bouchier, curate of Rathkeale, presented to the Lord Bishop, a memorial signed by the most respectable Protestant inhabitants of that parish, for the enlargement of Rathkeale Church, which at present affords accommodation to only 350 persons, thus leaving a considerable number of Protestants without an opportunity of attending Public Worship.

Mr. Colyer, M.P. for Sligo, has sent £20 towards liquidation of the debt due of the Primitive Wesleyan Chapel in that parish.

Resolutions were signed by the congregations of the different Catholic Chapels in this City, last Sunday, praying to continue Lord Mulgrave in the Vice Royalty of Ireland, and Lord Melbourne's Cabinet in office.

A sermon was preached on Sunday at Ennis Church by Rev. John Elmes, Vicar of St. John's, in this city, in relation to the funds raising for the relief of the distress prevalent in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland, when a collection was made to a considerable amount in aid of that object.

The Earl of Kenmare, upon application made to him, ordered Killarney, a highly respectable agent, Christopher Gallwey, to order a quantity of coals to be distributed amongst the poor on his Lordship's estate, at Hospital, in this county; and the Rev.
