A poor woman, named Peggy Howard, walking yesterday

sion, met with a most distressing accident by a heavy block  
of stone having fallen from one of the upper stories, and with  
such deadly weight upon her foot, as to crush the tendons  
and sinews, mangling the foot in a shocking manner. It was  
the mercy of Providence, that she and the infant in her arms  
were not stoned to death upon the spot, and their brains  
dashed about the street. The poor sufferer was removed to  
hospital in excruciating agony, and it was found necessary  
to amputate the foot from the ankle. This dreadful accident  
would have been averted, had a temporary fence-work been  
raised before the house.

Laurence Fitzgerald, a countryman, from Cahirnarry, died  
in hospital this week of fractured skull, another countryman  
named William Fitzgerald, of Carrigparson, having struck  
him a violent blow on the head with a pitchfork. A verdict  
of wilful murder is returned against his assailant.

until his man swept them into a hive.
