At Cork Assizes, Mr. Sergeant Greene said he could not refrain from remarking on the useless litigation in which many involved themselves, in appealing to tithe demands. It was of very serious moment to poor men, who, without any defence, entered appeals to the decrees below, by which they merely heaped additional costs upon themselves, without the remotest chance of getting a reversal. The present Assizes was much worse than any he before remembered—three-fourths of the Appeals being in claims for tithes, all of which, he might say, were affirmed with additional costs. His Lordship was occupied the entire day with appeals. He disposed of 290 out of 500.
