The late Dr. Carroll bequeathed £500 to the Rev. Dr. Hogan, P.P. of St. Michael's, for a Nunnery Chapel; and also a large sum to the Rev. Dr. Coll, of Newcastle.

An inquest was held on Sunday last, by John Cox, Esq. Coroner, on the body of David Lyons, who was found lying dead in a field near Adare. It appeared in evidence that he was employed drawing hay, and in going for the load lay on the car, which it is supposed upset, as he was found lying under it, quite dead. Dr. Johnston examined the body and found that he came by his death by suffocation. The jury returned a verdict accordingly, of "accidental death."
