A small party of Police, on Saturday night, apprehended a desperate lawless character of the name of Dwyer, at Enniskeigh, Tipperary, near the bounds of this county, and who for some months traversed the country armed, in defiance of the authorities. They made him prisoner with some difficulty in the midst of a group of labourers in a field, who soon gave the alarm, and collected a fierce multitude in front of the police, who took refuge with their prisoner in a cottage and fastened the door, but their assailants swore they would have the lives of the party, or liberate Dwyer. Accordingly they began tearing out the door and windows, and some of them actually set fire to the thatch roof, which rapidly lighted up. The Police driven to extremity fired, and shot one of their savage persecutors, who now broke in upon the small party, and rescued Dwyer from their custody after overpowering his escort, having in their fury broken the thigh of one, and fractured the head of the other policeman, whose recovery is despaired of.

Sunday last, a man of the name of Birrane had his skull fractured in the house of Michael McCarty of Nicker, where he was drinking. McCarthy, and his son-in-law Beary, are charged with the outrage.

Monday, Denis Connors, of New Pallas, in this county, died of wounds in the head, inflicted with a heavy stone by his own brother-in-law, Thomas Dwyer, after Connors, had gone to bed for the night in his own house, and unconscious of giving any provocation to his barbarous assailant. There was an inquest on the body, and a verdict of wilful murder returned.

Saturday evening, John Hogan, a labourer at the Distillery, was found drowned in the Wellesley dock, into which, it appears, he had fallen the evening before.
