Mr. Assistant Barrister Fallon will open the County Quarter Sessions at Newcastle, on Wednesday next. For the Bruff, Rathkeale, and Limerick Sessions, substitution of service has been, of necessity, effected by order of the Barrister, on court-house, church, and chapel doors, police stations, in upwards of 400 processes for clerical and lay tythe arrears, due in this County.

There are but three county registry notices served for Bruff sessions next month; for Limerick sessions, 38. Fifty-six registry notices are entered for the borough of Dungarvan, 4th January.

Mathew M'Carthy, a snuff grinder, died in Hospital this week, of the effect of wounds received from Michael Ahern, another of the trade, with whom he had been boxing in Park fields some days before. The Mayor held an inquest on the body. Verdict accordingly.
