On Thursday morning, Mary Collins, a widow of middle age, and her daughter Ellen, a girl of 14 years, were found dead in their bed, at Kilbane, near the hill of Newcastle, having retired the previous night in apparently good health. The circumstance naturally caused some excitement in the neighbourhood, and yesterday the Mayor held an inquest upon the bodies, the mother having been found lying on the daughter in the bed, but no marks of violence on the person of either. The brother, two sons, and servant of the elder female, slept in the house, but never heard any noise or alarm during the night, and could not assign any probable cause for the awfully sudden termination of life in this case. Drs. Lloyd and Moore made a post mortem examination of the mother, and found her stomach in a very irritable state, from inflammation. This induced a suspicion of the woman having intentionally, or through mistake, swallowed poison. However, as no evidence of the fact was brought out, the jury found a verdict—"Died by the visitation of God."

The body of Patrick Mathews, missing since Christmas last, was found in the river at Russell's Quay, on Thursday, by a boatman. The Mayor held an inquest on the remains.—Verdict—Accidental death.

A man of the name of Mitchell, who had been attending Hospital Petty Sessions, was returning home a few evenings since, when he was waylaid and murdered. For this atrocious crime there were committed to gaol yesterday, Michael Gleeson, Denis M'Carthy, Michael Ahern, George Carroll, and John M'Carthy, who will be tried at the county Assizes for the murder.
