FATAL CASUALTY.—Monday night and Tuesday
morning, one of those equinoctial gales, common at
this season of the year, blew with great fury from
the north, in violent squalls, which shook many
houses, and in Mary-street, near the corner of Bow-
lane, produced an awful calamity. A tremendous
gush of wind hurled a tall chimney stack in upon
the roof, with a frightful crash, and the whole
of the materials stones, bricks and mortar, carried down
roof, and floors, to the very basement story, burying
several of the tenants under an immense weight of
rubbish. The shock alarmed all the inhabitants of the
adjacent houses, who hurried to release such of the
unfortunate creatures, whose cries or moans could be
heard in the fright and confusion of the moment, which
the howling of the tempest rendered more difficult.
Eight persons were after some trouble delivered from
the ruins of the house, considerably hurt and wounded,
but painful to add, on the second floor a young
woman of the name of Margaret Morrison, with a child
about two and a-half years, Mary Morrison, who slept
there, were crushed to death by the mass of
materials which came down in the room. Henry
Morrison, the brother of the young woman, his
wife, father and mother, with another sister, all
slept on the same floor when this dreadful visitation
took place, and providentially escaped the violent
death of their two relatives, by the merest chance. The
Mayor held an inquest yesterday, upon the bodies
of the two sufferers, when the jury found a verdict in
accordance with the above circumstances. Morrison's
mother, one of those released from the ruins of the
house, was taken to the City Infirmary, terribly
mutilated, and her arm fractured in two places.
