## THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 28.

Parliament wont rise for the Easter recess until Wednesday, the 11th of April.

The Poor Law (Ireland) Bill finally went through committee of the House of Commons, on Friday night, and the report was ordered to be brought up on Monday.

Mr. David Roche, M. P. was presented to her Majesty at the Levee this day week by Lord Morpeth.

The Lord Lieutenant has sent to the Sheriffs a free pardon for Winifred Sullivan, under sentence of 7 years transportation, in the city gaol, for stealing a cloak, of which she was convicted at January Sessions.

On the evening of Monday, rather late, as Mr. John O'Donnell, of Court, was returning to his residence, from the neighbourhood of Rathkeale, where he had been on business, and endeavouring to make a short cut from Old Kindimo, he unfortunately perished from the effects of cold and the severity of the weather. An inquest was held before John Cox, Esq. Coroner, and a verdict returned accordingly. A man named Daniel Gorman, of Ballycasey, who had been to attend the funeral, unfortunately drank a little too freely, and on his way home was struck in the chest by the shaft of a covered jaunting car, which knocked him down and passed over him, from the effects of which he died on the following day.

Government solicited the Roman Catholic Bishop of Malta to become a member of the Council of that island, but he refused to qualify by taking the oath of allegiance to her Majesty.

Sir Frederick Stovill is reported to have been appointed to the post of Inspector of the Royal Stabulary. Sir Frederick is a Colonel in the Queen's, and formerly belonged to the 1st Regiment.

The total expense for the police force for the whole of Ireland for the year ending 1848 is £13s. 9d. the proportion borne by the counties, cities, and towns amounts to £204,169. 14s. 6d. borne by the counties, cities, and towns is £153,105 19s. 1½d.

Chief Constable Duncan and his party, employed in this county for several months on temporary service, were ordered to march to Clare, and marched in here on their en route to Ennis.

The County Limerick Turnpike Board has obtained another grant of £400 to open a new road from Ballinacurra to the Crescent.

The inhabitants of Clogherhead have petitioned the Constable Hill an article of public conduct. It was against the Constable that damages was found at last assizes.

Lord Cremorne is appointed to be Constable of Monaghan.

Lord Byron has succeeded in waiting upon the Queen.

The Commissioners for the improvement of navigation will make their arrangements for the claimants in this district, on the 1st of April.

The County Galway Grand Jurors of Weights and Measures have ordered one of them it appears used.

Considerable blame is attached to the wreck of which a cargo of Cork, wrecked on the coast of Waterford, has been reported in the Waterford Paper, it would appear that a superior officer, to have been appointed for these purposes, and the crew of the vessel, serious and wanton hardships, were lost during the terrific hurricane of the 19th inst. Under circumstances of extraordinary danger, the almost life of the vessel, (the *Active*), by the gallantry of Stuart, R.N. whose intrepidity on this occasion are spoken of in terms of high encomium, giving additional credit to his constantly earning on that service the saving of human life from shipwreck. Waterford, for these repeatedly memorialized the Lord Admiralty in this officer's favour, and it is honorable to both parties, that the name is yet known, but we trust that the Government will put two medals upon the Liverpool and Dublin.
