**DEATHS.**  
 Wednesday last, at Bertie-house, Leamington, after a short illness,  
 Colonel George O'Halloran, late 4th or King's Own Regt., no less  
 distinguished in his career as a brave and enterprising officer, than  
 as a highly honourable and courteous gentleman. He served origi-  
 nally in the 54th, under the gallant Sir Ralph Abercrombie, in  
 Egypt, and was wounded at the battle of Alexandria—subsequently  
 with equal distinction throughout the Peninsular war, under the  
 lamented Sir John Moore, and the illustrious Wellington, having  
 been again wounded at Corunna, and Salamanca, in which actions  
 the 4th bore a foremost part. The death of this much esteemed  
 veteran, will be much regretted by his old companions in arms, and  
 a numerous circle of friends—to his family in this city it is the  
 source of deep and lasting affliction.  
 On Thursday morning, in Thomas-street, Edward Parker, Esq.  
 after a very long protracted illness, which he bore with the utmost  
 fortitude and resignation to the will of the Almighty disposer of all  
 events. He held for the last 25 years the situations of Clerk of the  
 Crown, Town Clerk and Clerk of the Peace, for this City; and in  
 discharging the arduous duties of those offices, he endeavoured to  
 act with the strictest justice, urbanity and affability to all sects and  
 parties. He died sincerely and deservedly lamented by a numerous  
 circle of sorrowing relatives and friends, in the sure and certain  
 hope of the resurrection to eternal life, through the merits of Him  
 alone who gave his precious blood for the salvation of those, who lay  
 hold on the hope set before them in the Gospel.

 Precentor of this diocese, for many years Rector of the Union of  
 Castlebar, and father of the Rev. Mr. Hart, F.T.C.D.
