Francis William Bennett, late Quarter-Master British Auxiliary Legion, was discharged from his debts in London, this week.

Lieut. Curtis, 85th, has arrived from New York by the Great Western steamer.

A savage attack was made on Thursday last, upon a man at Mr. Bennett's gate, of Riverston, near Nenagh, by two men, who treacherously knocked him down with stones, and beat him in a brutal manner. John Croker, Esq, C.C. who happened to be riding by, finding the man in a desperate state covered with blood, and seeing the offenders take to flight, in a spirited manner pursued the principal, and after a severe chase for two miles, in which the fellow swam a river, and the officer quickly after him, succeeded in taking the fellow prisoner. Sub Constable Barry, also crossed the river in the pursuit, and assisted in bridging the prisoner into Nenagh, where he has been fully indentified by the wounded man who is dangerously ill.

An inquisition was taken on Thursday, before Alderman Watson, and Alderman Crips, at the City Hospital, on the body of Bridget Keeffe, who died from the effects of a beating inflicted by her husband, Michael Keeffe, who is fully committed for trial at the ensuing assizes.
