The police made several prisoners, but did not interfere in the question of toll. Five head of cattle died yesterday of the barbarous ill-usage they met, and many persons lost their stock in the confusion. A similar occurrence took place at the late fair of Nenagh.

A man of the name of Hayes was struck with a slane in the head at Cappamore, on Saturday, and killed. His assailant, of the name of Bray, has fled.
