The cause of the interruption of the new line of
road, from Courtbrack to the Crescent, arises from a
difference between the labourers and the contractor as
to wages, the former refusing to work under one shil-
ling a-day. Operations are in consequence suspended.

The new and continuous line of quays at the south
side of the river is proceeding with almost incredible
dispatch, under the superintendance of Sir Thomas
Deane and Co. to whom this important work appears
highly creditable.

On Monday evening, between the hours of seven

of them ; the Police from Galbally also went in pursuit,
but their station being some distance, too much time
was lost, and the criminals escaped.

Monday last about the hour of eight o'clock in the
evening, at Longford, parish of Ulla, in this county,
an armed party of men with their faces blackened,
went to the house of Martin Ryan, and violently
assaulted Oliver Boyle, carpenter in his employment,
for working under contract. Boyle received two cuts
in the head. The party fired three shots.
