By a recent act of Parliament, persons impounding
cattle are required to supply them daily with food, the
value of which is to be recoverable from the owner
by summonses before a Justice of the Peace, or
by sale of the animal in a public market after seven
days, upon giving three days previous notice. In
cases where the animals have been impounded more
than twenty-four hours without food, any person is
allowed to supply them.

The selection of free emigrants from the counties of
Clare, Limerick, and Tipperary, for the ship Charles
Kerr, is complete. They are composed of the most
respectable class of farm servants, black-smiths, car-
penters, &c., recommended by the resident magis-
trates, clergy, and gentry, of their neighbourhood,
who take a lively interest in their welfare. Doctor
Hall, R.N., the selecting officer for Ireland expressed
himself highly pleased with the selection made at the
office of Lt. Lynch, R. N., in this port. He departed,
on a similar duty, for Londonderry and Belfast, from
whence he will return on the latter end of the present
month, to embark the emigrants from Limerick. To-
tal number entered for embarkation at this port, 227,
including only six infant children. The majority of
these voluntary emigrants are from the county of
Clare.

Vessels are chartered by Government to take free
emigrants to New South Wales. from Derry in Oc-
tober; from Cork in November next.
