A murderous attack was made on the two Mr.

saying one word hit him three blows with a stick in

his brother fall, went to his assistance, and was imme-
diately attacked by two or three others, who knocked
him into a deep dyke at the side of the road, and after
receiving several blows and injuries, he was fortunate
enough to be able to make his escape towards Mount-
bolton. Mr. Gamble and his brother were opposed for
15 minutes, to 12 or 14 murderous villians, all intent
on taking their lives with sticks and stones, but
after a desperate struggle and hard fighting they were
able to walk away. Surgeons Brennan and Purcell
dressed their wounds which though severe and many,
are not dangerous. Mr. Henry Langley is very ill from
the effects of the blows given him by Rocket.
