Landlords, prior to persons having such estates, who have undertaken by certificate, are to be liable to the rent charge.

within two months after the passing of the Act, memorial to the Lord Lieutenant in respect to the arrears for the year, and are thereto to annex schedules of the same in like manner as for the loans under the Act, and they are particularly to specify the arrears as are due by the two following classes:—1. Those due by the class of lands which have been undertaken by certificate. 2. Those due by the second class above-mentioned: and the memorial to be signed by the person who would, at the time, have satisfied the same of rent-chargers under this bill. The memorial by these two classes are to be returned to the Lord Lieutenant in the same process, and added to the memorial by the other classes to be remitted, and a certificate to be paid to the owners, so far as respects the arrears for that purpose may avail.
