After a lingering illness, at Eccles-street, Dublin, whither he had gone for the benefit of professional advice, the Rev. Charles P. Coote. Rector of Doone, in this county, a clergyman who, for a series of years, devoted his income and his labour to the improvement of the condition of the working classes in that neighbourhood, and whose house was always a receptacle for the sick poor of the country. Yet what acknowledgement was subsequently rendered to this worthy Pastor, for the countless benefits so freely dispensed to his fellow-man, by a family whose very name used to evoke blessings on the name of Coote, in a wide and uncultured tract of country?—ingratitude the most heartless, and of the blackest dye-persecution the most malignant and unceasing, which instigated truculent assassins to take the life of him who was not long before regarded as the benefactor of his district. By the mercy of a good and just Providence the deadly aim was averted, and the blunderbuss discharged its contents harmlessly within a few yards of its destined victim, who was then returning from Sunday prayer at the parish church. For the actors in this atrocious outrage an immense large reward was offered, not indeed by Government, for the country gentlemen, and brethren in the Ministry, who knew his worth, supplied their deficiency; yet not one of the conspirators has been since that event brought to justice This was not, however, the only attempt on a life so precious to his family, and dear to his friends; but again were the assassing disappointed, and though his movements were industriously watched by day and night, nay, spies set to measure his steps, the Lord, whose faithful servant he had been, saved him from the grasp of murderers, and he eventually surrendered in christian peace and charity that life which the murderers would destroy, but which God hath transferred to mansions of eternal bliss, to participate On Wednesday, at Lismore, county Waterford, Mrs. Mar in glory for ever and ever.
