“ Sir James Clarke, the celebrated Court Physician, is a native of Scotland, and was for some years an Assistant-Surgeon of a small brig, from whence he was removed to Haslar Hospital to overhaul marines. He was recommended to the Queen by Prince Leopold, for whom he had performed some services shortly before his last marriage.
