The Profits of the Life Department, appropriated every Five Years, will be applied either to the reduction of the rate of the future Premium to be paid on the Policy, or to the increase of the Sum assured on the Life, as shall be most agreeable to the Assured; the party to make his choice at the time the proposition for Assurance is made.

The Profits of the Fire Department appropriated to

the Assured, will be distributed at the close of each successive period of Five Years, in the form of a percentage on the Premiums which have been paid.

At the two quinquennial divisions of profit in the Life Department, in 1829 and 1834, the sum appropriated to the holders of Policies for the whole term, was equivalent, on an average, to about 20 per cent. on the Premiums which had been paid.
