Imperative Presentments. TO THE CESSPAYERS OF THE LIBERTIES OF LIMERICK.

THE near approach of the coming Assizes induces me again to address you, on a subject of paramount and mutual interest—the lessening of Taxation on our oppressed Liberties. It has long been considered by our Grand Juries, that in the passing of 'Imperative Presentments,' no power was vested in them of analysing the details, and objecting to what appears to them either unjust or inexpedient. Let me here adduce the conduct of the Grand Jury of Cork.

I need not say, that in what are called with us, Imperative Presentments, the Police Establishment—Lunatic Asylum, &c. rank foremost—to confine myself for the present to the first of those very expensive establishments, I would state for your consideration, what has lately taken place with respect to Cork. I find that the Grand Jury there, at the last Assizes, objected to a certain item of the sum of £1011 18s 6d contained in the Presentment for a similar force; Baron Richards hesitated to decide, and reserved it for the consideration of the twelve Judges—their decision has been just communicated, which is in effect that the Grand Jury ought not to pass said item, and they have also directed that it should neither be charged nor levied; this has been officially announced to the proper authorities in Cork.

You also perceive that it was never either the wish or intention of the Legislature to deprive Grand Juries of the privilege of questioning what might seem objectionable, even in 'imperative presentments,' and refusing their sanction to whatever justice and law would fail to support. Would that we might, without being accused of yielding to the fancies of too sanguine a temperament, indulge the hope, that our Grand Juries, (about whom I shall make no further remark for the present,) would consider the example of their Brethren of Cork, so worthy of their study and imitation. Let them for once, on the coming opportunity, evince even an anxiety to relieve us from all unnecessary and illegal impositions, and forgiveness and forgetfulness of the past shall be their reward.
