Mrs. Elizabeth Wilson, matron of the Alms-house
on Dr. Hall's foundation, was returning from Adare,
on Sunday evening, with some of her family, when
the jaunting car was upset, by which Mrs. Wilson
suffered such serious injury, that she expired early
the next day, and at the request of a near relative,
the Mayor held an inquest, when it appeared in evi-
dence that the driver continued lashing his horse along
the road, and laid on the whip so mercilessly, that the
animal plunged and broke the harness, upsetting the
vehicle, from which the abvoe fatal casulty ensued.
John Supple, the driver, was accordingly commit-
ted on the verdict for homicide. Bonfires blazing
on the highway, a custom more honored in the
breach than the observance, upon John's eve, added to
the alarm which prevailed on this occasion, and most
probably helped to goad the horse into a state of des-
peration.

Mr. Eman, officer of Excise, returning on duty from

from his gig, the horse having shied and upset the
vehicle, under which Mr. Eman lay. Mr. Eman's
collar bone was fractured.

was severely hurt.
