Lyons on the County—fined and was remitted on their appearance. said—Mr. Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury, I am happy to perceive only seven cases returned for trial, which will not occupy much of your time as you have disposed of them, and in my fiscal business, I shall discharge you. I do not consider there is anything to go on that requires particular observation from me. I next addressed the County Grand Jury, that though he could not say there were many cases on their calendar, yet he considered them much lighter than on former occasions. I do not speak personally as to this, not having been advised of the County business, but from the Grand Jury would not have much to say. It was not necessary that he should, but to state that Mr. Sergeant M. J. O'Connell, had been appointed to preside in their Court, had been assisted by Messrs. O'Connell with heavy Civil business, and on the arrival, if requisite, offer such observations as the calendar may demand. The Baron then requested the Grand Jury to attend to the bills sent before them, and to expose no man to the ordeal of a public trial, unless there appeared rebutting evidence; and if one to escape where there was sufficient evidence to warrant his being sent to trial. The Grand Jury then withdrew, and his Lordship proceeded to the City Presentments, and subsequently to the County, which business occupied him until two o'clock.

The County Grand Jury made a presentation to the County Infirmary. I was not, probably, aware, that since the last time I received sentence of transportation from the Court, I had thus cleared the gaol for the Judges, having held an adjournment, for that purpose.—ED.
