A hair dresser, of the name of Lane, who died a member of the tee total Temperance Society, was respectably interred on Sunday, in St. Patrick's Church yard, on which occasion the funeral attracted an extraordinary multitude of spectators. The body was conveyed in a hearse drawn by four horses, and over 600 members of the Society, walked in procession with the Mathew medals suspended on their breasts. The burial service was read by four Roman Catholic Clergyman who joined the cavalcade.

William Courtney, a boy, was drowned off Thomond Bridge, on Sunday, by falling between some loose timbers into the river.

John Purcell, a young man, servant of Mrs. Philips, Crescent, was drowned on Monday morning at Meade's Quay, where he had gone to bathe, having incautiously ventured into deep water, though unable to swim. A fellow-servant who was bathing in company made two efforts to rescue him, but in vain. The body was found soon after, and the Mayor held an inquest—Verdict, 'accidental death.'

Catherine Shaughnessy, a native of Pallaskenry, died on Monday, in hospital, of severe laceration in the leg, caused by a tuck mill, at Newport, against which she had been pushed. The unhappy woman might have recovered the injury, by amputation of the limb, which was proposed, but she would not submit to the operation.
