## THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.

We can have now, unfortunately, but little hesitation in recording our conviction, after enquiries in this and the surrounding counties, that the harvest throughout the south and west of Ireland will not yield anything like a fair average crop; whether we consider the quality of the grain, which is sadly deteriorated by excessive rains, or the amount of produce, suffering by the same grievous visitation. Hay and straw will be deficient to an alarming extent, the great floods having totally destroyed many hundred tons of the former upon the banks of the upper and lower Shannon. Great part of the hay is still in the fields uncut, and rotting; potatoes from the long immersion are thoroughly saturated, soft and unwholesome; turf so bad, and deficient in the interior, that we doubt how the peasantry will get over the winter months; oats in general is yet a green thin crop, far from maturity, while barley, on the other hand, promises well; but all must be irrevocably lost, if another fortnight of the present harsh and unseasonable weather continues. The wheat has got tolerably over the ordeal this year, but we repeat, the oat, barley, and potatoe crops, are just now in imminent danger, unless we get a brisk dry wind, with genial sunshine.
